Project SAFE, the elementary level school resource program, is multi-faceted. Not only do the Deputy Sheriffs assigned to this program teach

Clinic News...Pat Casbarro, RN

We have completed our first head lice check for this school year. It is interesting to know that this is the second -most communicable disease among school-age children behind the common cold! In order to keep our children free of this health problem, it is very important for parents to check regularly for signs of head lice and to inform children of the importance of not sharing combs, brushes, hats, scarves, etc. Scratching is the most common sign that lice may be present, especially if the child is scratching behind the ears or at the nape of the neck. The lice eggs which are attached to the hair shaft are called "nits". They are translucent and about the size of a poppy seed. For those who have experienced this problem, please remember that there is no shame in getting lice, the shame is in keeping it!
